What is your favourite subject this year? Why?

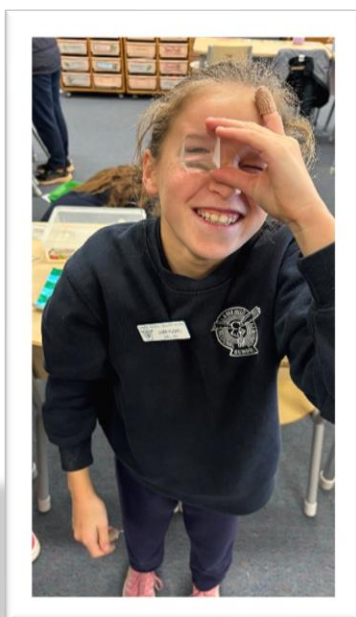
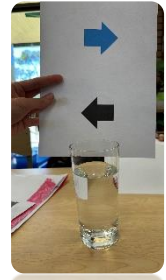

Year 4/5 Science with Mrs Wait



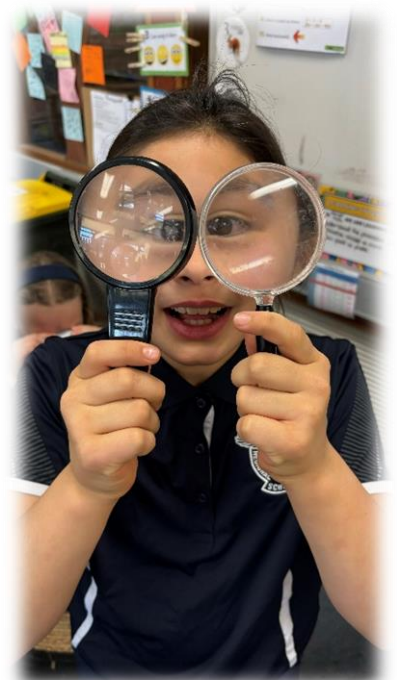
"During Science with Mrs Wait the Year 4/5 class has been conducting experiments with light focusing on reflection, refraction and transparency"
