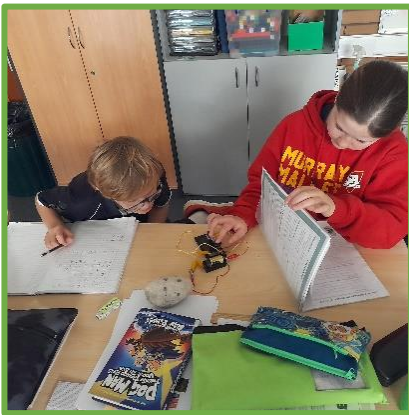

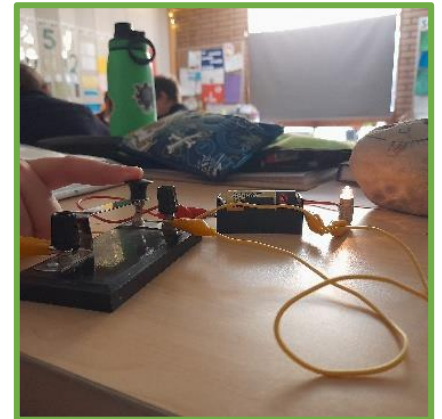
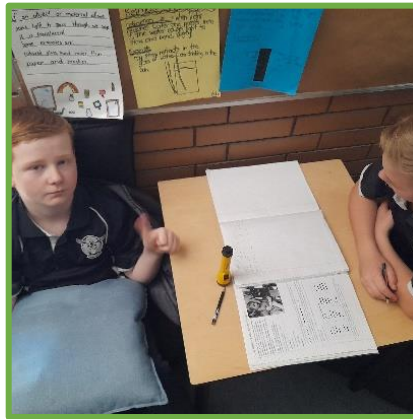

"Kindy Play is fun because I enjoy seeing my buddy. Also, I love playing in the Kindy yard"

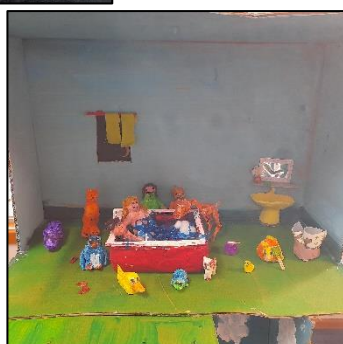
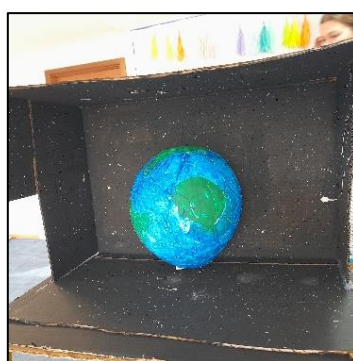
