Math-tastic Challenge!


The Year 9 Maths class have been working on the measurement topic and have been practicing drawing in 3D using isometric paper and looking at drawings from different aspects and perspectives. This enables them to have a better understanding of area, surface area and volume.

Here is a challenge for you to try at home:

Imagine you are suspending a cube from one vertex (corner) and allowing it to hang freely. Now imagine you are lowering the cube into water until it is exactly half submerged.

What shape does the surface of the water make around the cube?



This problem has been adapted from the book "Sums for Smart Kids" by Laurie Buxton, published by BEAM Education.




Year 9 Maths students practicing their 3D drawing

Year 1's have been busy designing, making and appraising in Integrated Studies. They have had fun making a variety of things including boats, masks and wands. Lots of fun hands on learning.





All workshops held at The Museum, so come and try your hand on some of the printing presses.


