END OF YEAR REPORTS

At the end of term four students receive a written report from their teacher. The purpose of the report is to communicate student learning with parents. Students are given grades* using an A-E scale for each learning area. When assigning a grade, teachers make an on-balance professional judgement about the student's level of achievement. The grade is based on a range of evidence of students' knowledge, skills and understandings and their ability to apply their learning in unfamiliar contexts. This evidence includes work samples, assessment information, and teacher observations over time. Importantly, teachers also provide a written comment with each grade. The comment provides further details of what the student has achieved, the learning that has been covered, and learning goals.

In addition to written reports, teachers also send home student portfolios. Portfolios include student work samples in a variety of learning areas. These work samples provide parents with an insight into the learning that is being covered. Work samples will also have additional background information about the task as well as the criteria that the student is being assessed against.

We believe that by focusing on the learning and working with students to be thriving and engaged problem solvers, we are empowering our students, at all levels and ages, to be intrinsically motivated to take charge of their learning by setting learning goals and targets and be prepared for the future. We look forward to continuing to work in partnership with you to help your child achieve their current and future learning goals in 2026 and beyond.


