#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

#### **PAT testing**

This term (weeks 7-10), students in Years 1 – 6, will again participate in the Progressive Achievement Testing (PAT) in Reading and Numeracy. The PAT tests provides us with data about student learning in the areas of reading (particularly comprehension) and numeracy. PAT testing occurs every year, and provides us with an opportunity to measure student growth, by comparing the most recent data with data from previous years. Time is then spent analysing the data and using it to inform our planning, teaching and Site Learning Priorities.

#### **Phonics Screen Check**

The phonics screen check is a Department wide test for all students in year 1 and takes places during weeks 3-6. It is a short, simple assessment that tells teachers how students are progressing in phonics. It takes only 5–7 minutes and is carried out by classroom teachers with each student individually. Teachers then analyse the results and, if necessary, plan for any additional support that students might require.

#### **Community Canteen and Canteen Works**

We are thrilled to announce the opening of our brand-new canteen at Munno Para Primary School. Over the holidays, the canteen works were completed, and it is looking fantastic. The canteen will be open for over-the-counter sales from Tuesday to Thursday at lunchtimes, offering a variety of options for our students.

#### Site Learning Plan

We are delighted to share some positive progress towards our goals in our Site Learning Plan. By using the recent Wellbeing Engagement and Collection data as measures for our success, we have achieved significant milestones.

Goal 1: Students have positive dispositions (resilient, resourceful and reflective) when working in Mathematics.

We've seen an 11% increase in Academic self-concept, reflecting our students' growing confidence and positive attitudes towards Mathematics.

Goal 2: Develop and strengthen students' social and emotional skills to ensure they are ready to learn and actively engage in their education.

Our focus on social and emotional development has led to an 11% increase in Cognitive engagement, showing improved focus and participation.

Goal 3: Learners are empowered to develop a sense of identity and responsibility as they participate in our school community.

We've achieved a 7% increase in Connectedness to school, highlighting stronger relationships and a sense of belonging.

These achievements are a testament to our collective efforts. Thank you for your support and commitment to our shared vision.




#### FIRST NATIONS


We are pleased to offer this experience at no cost to families.
