Site Learning Plan

Goal 1: Students have positive dispositions (resilient, resourceful and reflective) when working in Mathematics.

• Teachers continue to expose students to the Mathematics and Specialist dispositions for learning. Learning dispositions are the attitudes, habits, and ways of thinking that influence how a student approaches learning. They go beyond academic skills and knowledge — they reflect the learner's mindset and behaviour when faced with challenges, new experiences, or opportunities to grow. A current focus in mainstream classes is supporting our learners to be reflective. Being reflective helps learners make sense of what they're doing, recognise their strengths, and identify areas for improvement.

Goal 2: Develop and strengthen students' social and emotional skills to ensure they are ready to learn and actively engage in their education.

D4 3D MONSTERS



MATHS DISPOSITIONS


Earlier this year I shared with you all about some of the work we have been doing as a whole school around building students' positive dispositions when working in Maths. This has had a particular focus on the three dispositions from the new SA Curriculum- resilient, resourceful and reflective.

Throughout the last two terms students have been provided with lots of intentional opportunities in Maths lessons to understand these dispositions and demonstrate them when solving problems and working on Maths tasks. All classes started with brainstorming their own ideas of how these dispositions can be shown and what language students might use when showing them.

As a staff we then shared the class responses and decided on some key language. These responses were then collated to develop our whole school language statements for each of the dispositions. These are our three dispositions posters that are displayed around the school in classrooms and intervention spaces to make the language accessible for students to use when working in Maths. It would be wonderful for you to have a read of them and, where you can, use these statements to have conversations with your child about their Maths learning.

Throughout the remainder of this year, we are going to be working on different ways we can embed the Maths dispositions into classroom practice. We will also develop some ways that we can support students to notice and name the dispositions they themselves are using and that





I reflect on how I feel about the learning before, during and after working through a task.




I reflect on what I already know to plan strategies I will try. I think about if I have done any similar tasks before to help me.

They were able to choose their own 'baby', dress it, name it and learn how to wrap it up safely. They were then lucky enough to visit the nursery where they weighed and measured their babies, and wrote them out an identifying name tag to place around the ankle. Lastly they were given the opportunity to perform an ultrasound on a bladder to check that it was working properly. This is a check done on most new mothers to ensure that they are fit and healthy and ready to go home. It was a wonderful experience at a lovely hospital and hopefully might inspire some students to want to become a midwife in the future!
