2025 YEAR IN REVIEW: LAUNCHING THE LIZARD LOUNGE AND CELEBRATING STUDENT VOICE




CURRICULUM 2025 WRAP UP

This year our staff and students have taken actions and been involved in learning that builds positive learner dispositions. We have worked collaboratively to create our whole school disposition language for each of the three Mathematics dispositions from the SA Curriculum. Students have engaged in a range of rich tasks as part of their learning to support them to notice these dispositions and build a range of strategies they can use when working in Maths. Within specialist learning areas students have also been building learner dispositions relevant to working in these subject areas.

We have had students across K and D block involved in Bond Blocks intervention this year. It has been wonderful to see the growth students have made and the range of addition and subtraction skills they have been able to develop fluency with. Next year the Bond Blocks program will expand to include M blocks students as well.

Across both literacy and numeracy, we have seen great student engagement, growth and achievement and all students should be so proud of all they have achieved this year. We look forward to all that is to come for our students in 2026.

On Tuesday, 9th December, we marked this special milestone with a presentation and celebration dinner. It was a wonderful evening to recognise our students' achievements, reflect on their journey, and wish them all the best for the future.

WELLBEING WRAP

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

This year, our PBL team concluded their final training sessions, positioning us to further embed PBL practices across the school. Key initiatives included:

- Clearly documented and explicitly taught Non-Classroom Procedures (NCPs) such as safe use of taps, waiting in the office, and appropriate playground behaviour.
- A focus on teaching students expected behaviours and reinforcing these with positive praise and tokens ("gems") when expectations are met

Major Achievements in 2025:

- Developed and implemented a new encouragement system aligned with the new 'Gem' sports teams.
- Increased visibility of Ecko Gecko at numerous school events, reinforcing positive behaviour.
- Over 25 students actively engaged with our Ecko Checko system.
- Successfully implemented daily circle time following recess.
- Achieved a 58% reduction in after-recess behavioural incidents during Term 4.
- Delivered whole-school lessons on the values of Respect, Responsibility, and Success.
- Consistently utilised our teaching matrix to deliver weekly lessons to all students.

Looking Ahead to 2026:

- Further analyse behaviour data to drive school-wide improvements.
- Continue explicit teaching of school values.
- Increase Ecko's involvement at school events.
- Enhance signage of NCPs throughout the school.
- Strengthen supports for Tier 2 and Tier 3 behaviours, ensuring all students receive appropriate interventions.

Regulation

In 2025, we launched a significant new initiative from the ground up: The Zone.

- Over the 2024-2025 holidays, staff constructed The Zone—a dedicated space where students can work on self-regulation for 10-minute intervals, providing targeted and supported regulation breaks.
- Throughout the year, The Zone supported over 68% of our students, contributing to a marked reduction in behavioural incidents and take-homes/suspensions.
- All classes participated in the 10-module Zones of Regulation program, adopting its language school-wide.
- The Zone staff collaborated with classroom teachers to create 'toolboxes' of regulation strategies for classroom and everyday use.

Plans for 2026:

- Maintain and further develop The Zone.
- Adopt an even more targeted approach to supporting students with regulation needs, ensuring responsive support for every learner.
