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Dear Two Wells Primary School Community,

As we continue to foster a nurturing and productive learning environment, I would like to emphasise the importance of regular and punctual attendance for all our students. Attending school on time every day is crucial for your child's academic success and overall development.

Punctuality Matters

Our classrooms open at 8:30 am, allowing students to settle in and prepare for the day ahead. The morning circle begins promptly at 8:40 am, providing an essential opportunity for students to connect with their peers and teachers, setting a positive tone for the day. Curriculum learning, particularly in literacy, starts at 8:50 am. Missing these initial activities can disrupt your child's learning routine and impact their educational progress. Early departures and regular late pick-ups have also increased during these colder months. Whilst we understand the complexities of families, the juggle of work and emergencies out of the norm occur, we ask that children are regularly picked up promptly at 3:00pm. Many of our staff conclude their workday at 3:00pm with a small number of staff continuing until 3:25 meaning we do not have the capacity to continue duty of care for children past 3:00pm on a daily basis. Happy Haven OSHC operate onsite from 3:00pm and are imperative in supporting our families who cannot facilitate a 3:00pm pick up <https://twowellsps.sa.edu.au/for-families/happy-haven-oshc-two-wells/>

Next year, in 2026, we will continue to uphold our commitment to student safety and learning. Duty of care in the yard will commence at 8:30 am, with teachers on yard duty ensuring a safe environment. Classroom learning will begin at 8:40 am, allowing us to maximise instructional time.

down to the main street and back. We are so grateful to all spectators and businesses who lined the streets to cheer us on.

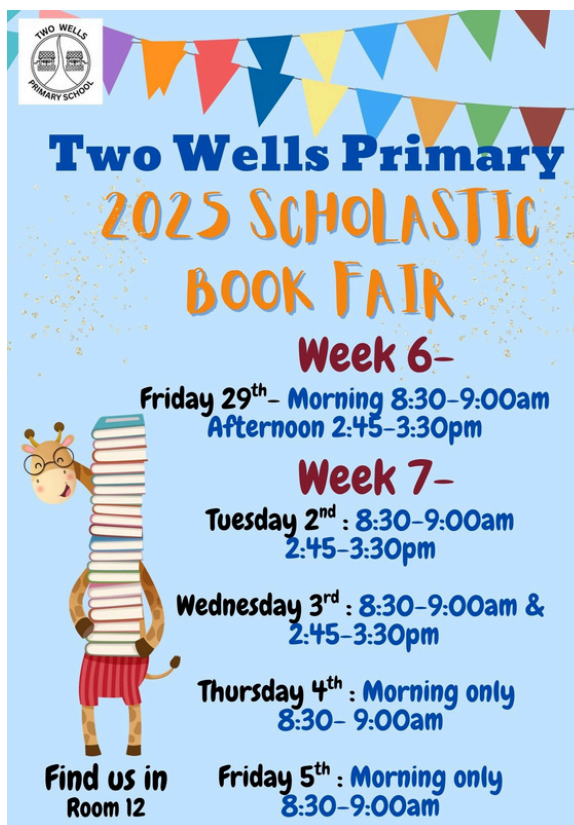

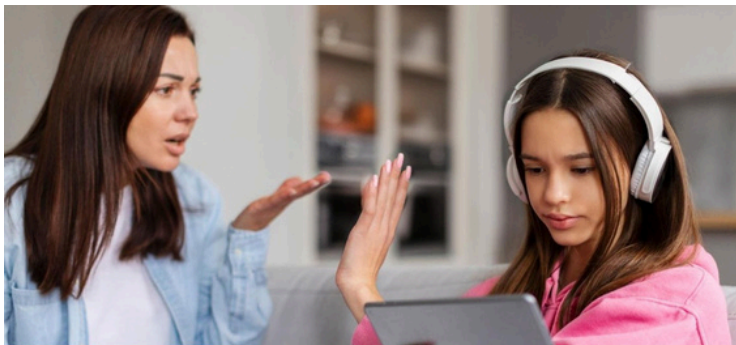
