In Room 15 the 5/6s have been focusing heavily on our mathematical fluency. Being fluent in Mathematics means having the ability to connect mathematical concepts, accurately recall foundational facts, and flexibly choose the most efficient strategy to solve both everyday and abstract problems.

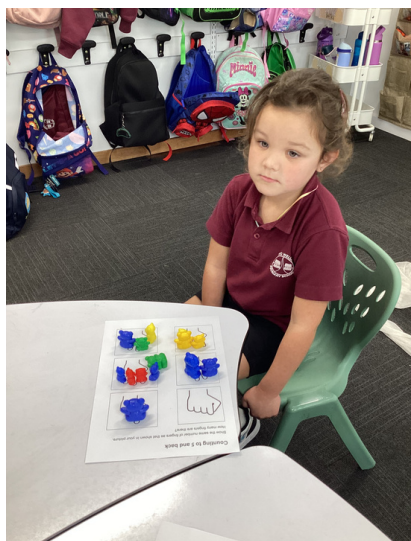
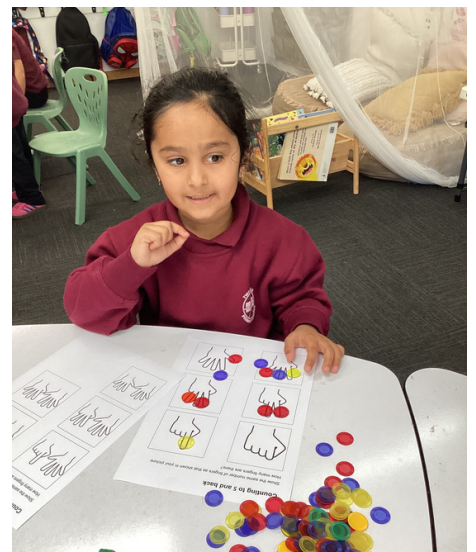
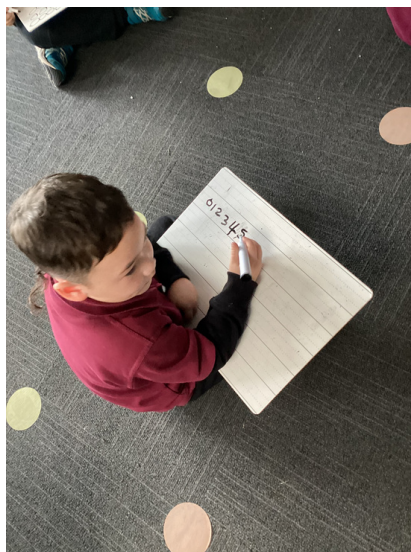
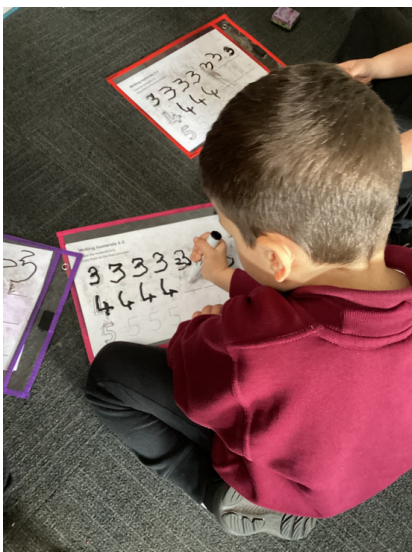
Every Friday we have 'Friday Fluency' rotations where we play games and work on tasks that help boost these skills. Our favourite game is Target, where you need to make a target number using 3-5 number cards and any of the four operations.

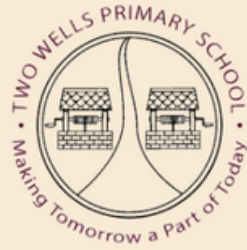
Here's a challenge for you! Try one of our games, Make 24. You need to create a mathematical equation to equal 24, using all of the 4 numbers on the card, only once. There could be more than one way to make 24!



In Room 10 we have been exploring the wonderful world of numbers through hands on activities and engaging lessons. Students have enjoyed matching counting manipulatives to numbers and practising their numeral writing skills. Our start of year students are working up to 15, while our mid-year students are focusing on numbers up to 5.

These activities, along with lots of counting practice, are helping our learners build confidence with early maths skills and setting a strong foundation for the term ahead. Our start of year students have also taken on a teacher role by introducing the mid-years to a fun roll-the-dice game called "Get Out of My House!" In this game, students roll the dice and match the number on the dice to the number on the game board, reinforcing their skills in a collaborative and engaging way.

THE SMITH FAMILY SAVER PLUS PROGRAM

To check eligibility or request a callback, families can visit the Saver Plus website or call **1300 610 355**.

Saver Plus is a free matched-savings and financial education program designed to help eligible families plan and save for school-related costs, including camps and essential learning items.

How it works:

Families who join the program can:

- Save up to \$50 per month over a 10-month period
- Complete free online MoneyMinded financial education workshops
- Receive matched savings dollar-for-dollar, up to \$500

This means families may access up to \$1,000 to put towards education expenses such as:

- School camps
- Uniforms
- Laptops or other devices
- Stationery and supplies

Families can join at any time during the year. Once the program is completed, matched funds can be used for approved education-related costs.

Eligibility criteria (all must apply):

- Hold a current Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card
- Receive an eligible Centrelink payment
- Have a school-aged child (including those starting next year or homeschooled), or be studying themselves
- Have a regular income (e.g. employment, Carer Payment, Child Support, or cash income)
- Be aged 18 years or over
- Be willing to participate in free online MoneyMinded workshops
- Not have completed the Saver Plus program before.

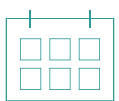

HOW ENTRIES WORK

The Victor Harbor Art Show uses a two stage online entry process.



STEP 1

Submit artwork online through the Art Show portal, including:

- A quality photograph of the artwork
- Artwork details
- Entry payment



STEP 2

Following the closing date, all artworks are reviewed by the Selection Panel.

Successful entrants will then be notified and invited to deliver their artwork to the exhibition.



ARTWORK REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ Original artwork only.
- ✓ Maximum of three artworks per artist.
- ✓ Standard artworks must not exceed 1 square metre, including the frame.
- ✓ Diptychs, triptychs and multi panel works may be entered as a single artwork.

PREPARING ARTWORK

- ✓ Begin creating artwork during Term 3.
- ✓ Photograph completed works in good lighting.
- ✓ Keep artwork safely stored until delivery.
- ✓ Ensure artwork is presentation ready for exhibition if selected.



IF SELECTED

Accepted artworks will be delivered to the Victor Harbor Art Show at Warland Reserve, Victor Harbor, before the exhibition opens in January 2027.

Full delivery dates and collection details will be provided to successful entrants following selection.
