This term, our school value focus is Resilience. We will be encouraging students to practise resilience in all areas of their school life:

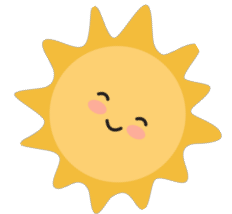
- In the classroom: Students will be supported to tackle challenges in their learning, persist when tasks are difficult, and use positive strategies to manage setbacks or mistakes.

From the desk of the Deputy Principal



Dear Parents/Caregivers,

As of March 1st, 2024, smoking and vaping are banned within 10 metres of the boundary of all schools and early childhood services in South Australia. This law applies to public and private schools, with a maximum penalty of \$750 for breaching this regulation.

Key Rules and Information:

- **10-Metre Buffer:** The ban extends to a 10-metre area beyond the school boundary (fence) in public areas.
- **No Smoking/Vaping Zone:** The ban covers all tobacco products and e-cigarettes (vapes).
- **Included Areas:** The ban applies to surrounding public areas, including footpaths, public parks, and playgrounds adjacent to schools.
- **Penalties:** Individuals can face an on-the-spot fine of \$105 or a maximum penalty of \$750 upon conviction.
