I would like to begin by expressing my sincere gratitude to all the volunteers who joined us to help lift the pavers for our new playground. With 35 helpers, this was a wonderful example of our community working together. Thank you again to everyone who gave their time and effort.

I am excited to announce that the playground installation began in week 2 and is expected to finish by the end of week 3. Once we have completed the KidSafe inspection, our students will be able to enjoy the new play space!

In week 10 of term, 3, we installed new interactive boards in every classroom. These screens provide both staff and students with clearer, interactive displays and better access to learning resources. Most importantly, the new boards are easy to read for everyone. Staff are also continuing their professional learning to make the best use of inclusive technology in all learning areas. 
