I am excited to share that our school values banners have now been installed on the Worlds End Highway fence, thanks to the hard work of our Parent Club. 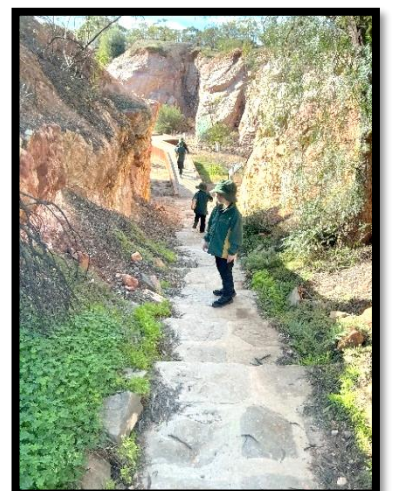
Mid-Year Reception Transition

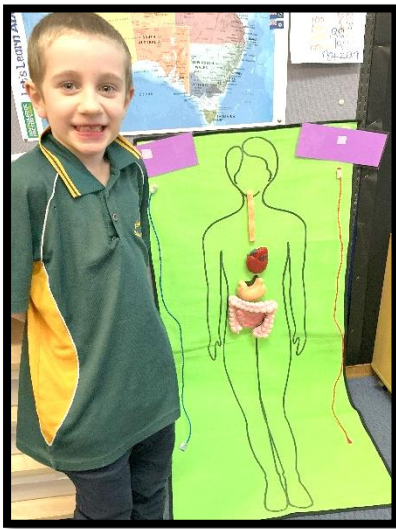


Life Ed (Healthy Harold) Visit
