PRINCIPAL'S REPORT CONTINUED

Mobile Phones and Electronic Communication Devices

As mentioned in our last newsletter, and in-line with Department for Education guidelines, we are considering an opportunity to introduce Yondr pouches as a measure to reduce mobile phone distraction and associated undesirable behaviours arising from inappropriate use, and to improve student learning, participation and overall wellbeing.

Governing Council have discussed this initiative, indicating their support, and further information will be provided to families in due course. NB: the Yondr pouch system will not impact any approved exemptions which will remain in place.

As we prepare to roll out this initiative, please note that mobile devices are not an acceptable payment method for our school canteen, and from Term 3 this will be phased out. Please ensure you arrange alternative methods of payment for canteen purchases such as cash, bank card or via the Spriggy school payment app (accessible via parent/quardian device). Thank you for your partnership in advancing our school.

Implementation of Two-Way Radios

This term we have implemented the use of staff two-way radios during recess and lunch time yard duty in response to student and staff desire for increased yard supervision, coverage and communication. The radio system is proving to be an effective and efficient tool for keeping our students safe.

NHS TEACHER HONOURED

Nuriootpa High School Teacher David Bowley Honoured for 'Outstanding Contribution to Agricultural Education'

49 Years of Service Celebrated at State Agriculture Teachers Conference!

On Friday May 9, at the South Australian Agriculture Teachers Association's Biannual Conference, the award for 'Outstanding contribution to Agricultural Education', was bestowed upon David Bowley for his exceptional service to agricultural learning across South Australia.

With an impressive 49 Year career behind him, Mr Bowley has become a towering figure in agricultural education and is admired for his no-nonsense teaching style, relentless work ethic and unshakeable dedication to hands-on, community-connected learning. His influence spans generations of students, educators and industry professionals.

Mr Bowley's formal agricultural journey began in 1971 at Adelaide University and continued at Waite Campus, where he completed a Bachelor of Agricultural Science with Honours in 1975. University peer Gerald Wright, remembers Bowley as a standout student and spirited motorcycle enthusiast, a hobby that would become a lifelong passion and one of many colourful threads in the tapestry of his career.

After graduating, Mr Bowley took up his first teaching role in 1977 at Booleroo Centre where he quickly established himself as a respected and impactful educator. Long time colleague Kathryn Kupke recalls: "He had the respect of the students with his no-nonsense behaviour management and great relationship skills. Among staff, he was affectionately known as 'The King', - a title he absolutely earned."

Over the years, Mr Bowley served not only as a teacher but also as a mentor, SACE Agriculture Moderator and long term volunteer at the Ag Learning Centre, supporting agricultural education across the state.

In 1998, Mr Bowley joined Nuriootpa High School, where he would later become known for leading the school's Nurihannam Wine Program. From 2007 to 2018 and again from 2021 onwards, he guided students through the entire winemaking process, from pruning and crushing to blending and bottling.

In 2022, he started mentoring the new Wine Manager – Milly Hoffmann, which still continues to this day. His mentorship in this space has been transformative, inspiring students to pursue careers in viticulture, agribusiness, and other careers with school-based apprenticeships and beyond.

As an Assistant Principal and Vet Coordinator, David's passion has been getting student's into careers under his leadership.

Over his time at NHS he has been instrumental in running Year 12 programs, from Agriculture Science, School Assessed Agricultural Studies and VET course for stable hands.

His efforts haven't stopped at the vineyard gate or the winery door. Mr Bowley helped build partnerships with local winemakers and hosted international delegations, famously winning over visitors from the Philippines, Texas, and Russia, particularly the latter, where, as one story goes, he finally met an interpreter fast enough to keep up with his rapid speech.

Mr Bowley's impact reaches far beyond any classroom or vineyard. His guidance has shaped programs, inspired educators, and left a legacy that continues today.



In recognition of his outstanding career and service to the profession, the South Australian Agriculture Teachers Association proudly honoured David Bowley - a true champion of agricultural education, and as many agree, a top bloke and a true king of Ag education!

FINANCE REPORT

We would like to inform you of some important updates regarding the way Nuriootpa High School receives payments. These changes align with Australian Accounting Standards and Department for Education (DfE) policies, and are aimed at improving security and compliance.

Payment Options

Due to policy changes, we can no longer accept written credit card details on forms. However, we can still receive payments via the following methods:

- Cash, cheque or EFTPOS at the Finance Office
- Credit card / Visa Debit card over the phone
- Spriggy Schools for excursions, casual days, and uniform payments

Using Spriggy Schools

To make payments for excursions, casual days or uniforms through Spriggy:

- 1. Visit www.spriggyschools.com.au to register and download the **Spriggy Schools** app. (You can also search "Spriggy Schools" in your device's app store.)
- 2. Add a profile for each of your students, ensuring you select Nuriootpa High School and the correct year level.

School Card Assistance

School Card applications are now overdue.

If you believe you may be eligible, please apply **as soon as possible** via the online application: www.sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard

Eligibility includes:

- Families with children aged 4+ attending school full-time
- Independent full-time students in Years 10–12
- Adult re-entry students completing SACE subjects

Your family's **gross income** for the 2022/23 financial year must be below the set threshold (based on the number of dependent children) to qualify.

What School Card covers:

- \$396 of the Materials & Services Charge
- The remaining \$114 will be waived if School Card is approved

Please note: Applications must be submitted annually.

YEAR 11 AGRICULTURE



On Friday, 16th May, our Year 11 Agriculture class enjoyed an exciting and educational excursion to **Days Eggs**, a world-class egg production and grading facility located at Lower Light.

Students gained valuable insights into the history of the company and its key partnerships—including McDonald's and all major supermarket chains. The visit provided a comprehensive overview of the various egg-laying production systems, the scale and locations of the farms, and the critical importance of biosecurity and animal welfare in modern agriculture.

A highlight of the day was the tour of the **state-of-the-art grading facility**, which can process up to **127,000 eggs per hour**—grading, detecting imperfections, discarding, washing, sanitising, and packaging eggs into cartons with impressive speed and precision.

Students also had the opportunity to explore a newly built shed housing **20,000 chickens**, where they learned about the cutting-edge systems used to support both high productivity and excellent animal welfare standards.

A huge thank you to **Jess Spencer** from Days Eggs for generously sharing her time and expertise.

It was a fantastic opportunity to see a leading South Australian agribusiness in action!




TREASURY WINE ESTATE EXCURSION



After visiting the school winery last term, the STEM class set to work designing machines to automate various processes and boost productivity in the wine industry.

Students have been developing models such as guided harvesting machines, automated crushers, bottle labellers, automatic guided forklifts, and more. 


