Tabbi - for challenging herself and persevering with new learning.

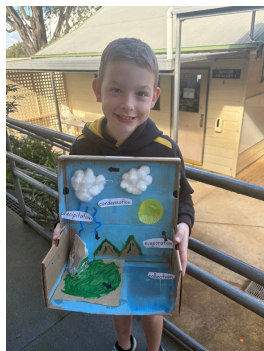
CAINE'S ARCADE

Bee Art

UPB has been learning about native bees after our YEL leaders learned about these Precious Pollinators in term 1. Did you know that there are about 2000 native bee varieties in Australia? Most are solitary, don't produce honey or have stingers! They are also fantastic natural pollinators for our native plants. Students chose a local native bee species to learn about, designed their bee using pastel, and painted it's preferred native flower in the background with watercolour. They've also been designing hotels for their specific native bees in technology and are looking forward to making them in the next few weeks ready to go in our garden!
