BBCS ENROLMENT PROCESS

Students under 16 years of age:

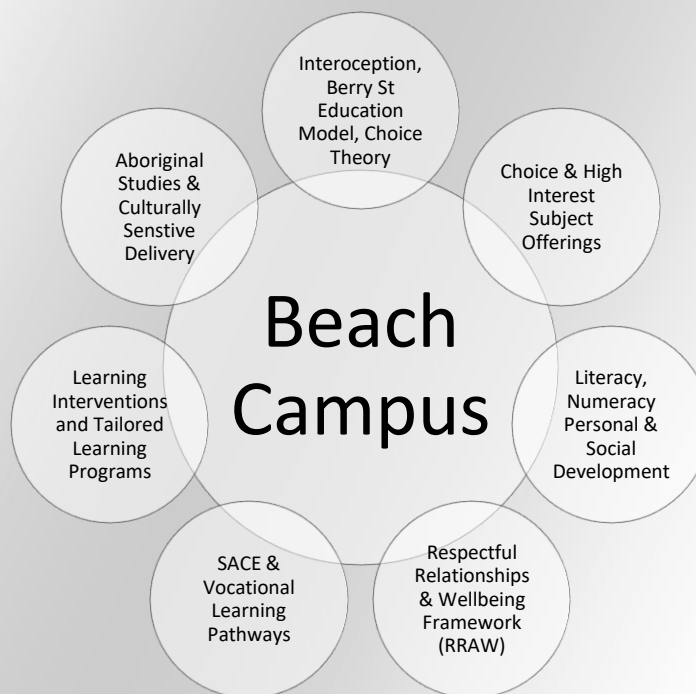
Students under 16 years of age are referred by a Department for Education assigned Behaviour Support Educator (BSE) who consults with the current school and the family to negotiate an enrolment meeting.

Students 16 to 17 years of age:

Students over 16 years of age may self-enrol at the school. Enrolment is dependent on available places. And conditional on attending an interview appointment, a clear mapping of learning goals as well as the student's suitability for placement according to our enrolment procedures.

MIDDLE SCHOOL (Year 7 to 10)

Timetabled lessons covering the CORE areas of learning in the South Australian Curriculum aligned to Version 9.0 of the Australian Curriculum

SENIOR SCHOOL (Year 11 & 12)

A variety of SACE subjects offered including compulsory and elective SACE subjects.

VET

Vocational Education Training runs in conjunction with external Training Organisations to support students to attain job ready qualifications

TRANSITION PROGRAM

Students supported to engage with external job network providers and transition case management prior to exiting school

WORKPLACE LEARNING

Work Experience, Worksite visits, Try-a-trade Expos and Career Pathway Counselling

TAILORED LEARNING PROGRAM

Literacy & Numeracy Support, Short Courses, Re-engagement Programs, Personal Development Programs, Transition & SACE options for students unable to attend school



WHAT IS BOWDEN BROMPTON COMMUNITY SCHOOL?
