## **Adelaide Show Camp**

Recently, Kangaroo Inn Area School students had the opportunity to travel to Adelaide to attend the Royal Adelaide Show camp. Year 7 students engaged in curriculum-related activities centred around the show, while Year 8 and 9 students participated in the School Wether Competition. They were evaluated on their knowledge of the nutritional requirements and breeding bloodlines of their sheep, as well as the presentation and neatness of their school display area.

The students showcased their skills by leading their sheep for judging in the "Best Pen of Three" category and demonstrated their ability to handle the animals proficiently. Following this, the sheep were shorn, and the fleece values were calculated.

Although the school did not place in the "Best Pen of Three" category, their fleece wool was recognised among the most valuable fleeces at the show. The camp provided students with invaluable experience in training and handling sheep, alongside developing their skills and knowledge in wool handling.



















# Yr. 2-6 Bird Room & Bool Lagoon Excursion

Students from Years 2 to 6 had a fascinating day exploring the wonders of local wildlife. At the Bird Room, Marian and Pat welcomed us into their incredible collection of over 600 animal specimens. Students had the rare opportunity to see birds up close, sparking curiosity and supporting our Learning Expeditions on local bird habitats and materials. We then ventured to Bool Lagoon, where we walked the boardwalk surrounded by the sounds of frogs and wetland life. Using bird-watching kits kindly provided by the Millicent Library, students identified a variety of wetland birds including magpie geese and black swans. It was a memorable day of hands-on learning and nature discovery!


