

SITE LEARNING PLAN – SLP

Last Pupil Free Day, all staff attended Kingston Community School for a joint Professional Learning Day led by Shane Crawford, our critical mentor/consultant.








The day was focused on our impact area of effective learners and how dispositions for learning play a crucial role in their development. The first part of the morning was RPS staff revising our journey so far with our 'Learning to learn – Learning for Life' framework of the Engagement Continuum, the Learning Pit and Brain Science; to review and reflect upon impact and take a closer look at the role of dispositions. Our WEC data for 2025 indicates small shifts in:

- Academic self-concept 2024 85% to 2025 -92%
- Perseverance 2024 84% to 2025 87%
- Well-being literacy 2024 62% to 2025 65%




Small but significant shifts that we hope keep increasing as 'Learning to Learn – Learning for Life' becomes authentically embedded in our school culture. Kingston and Robe primary colleagues – teachers and SSO's - then split into small groups to share practice and pedagogy around effective learners. This experience was highly valued by all the staff of both schools. We ended the day with groups of educators creating visuals of effective learners using creativity as the driving force – it was highly engaging – a great way to capture thinking and end our PL day of collaboration.

Onward and upward – as said before, it's a very exciting time for our school and education in SA.

DID YOU KNOW?

Update about Social Media – source: eSafety News <u>esafetynews@esafety.gov.au</u>



From mid-December, the Australian Government will require certain social media services to take steps to prevent under 16s from having accounts.

As Australia's online safety regulator, eSafety will be responsible for implementing these changes. Here's what parents need to know right now:

- 1. It's not a ban, it's a delay. We're giving kids more time to build digital skills and resilience before facing the pressures of social media.
- 2. **The responsibility lies with the platform**. There are no penalties for children or parents—only for platforms that fail to take reasonable steps to prevent under 16s from having accounts.
- 3. **You're not alone**. eSafety offers trusted resources for <u>parents and carers</u>, <u>educators</u>, <u>young people</u> and <u>kids</u>. We've got the flags, the swimming lessons, and the safety tips to help you support your kids. And our protective powers in areas such as <u>cyberbullying</u> and <u>image-based abuse</u> will still be there to help if things go wrong.

Australia is building a culture of online safety—just like we've done on our beaches. Because the internet, like the ocean, is not going away—and our kids are already dipping their toes in.

SAFE SPACES FUNDRAISING APPLICATION

As part of the 2025 Bullying No Way: National week of action I have applied for a 'safe spaces' grant for \$15 000. The application will be assessed by the Engagement and Wellbeing Directorate's behaviour team and we will know the outcome of our application by term 4 week 1.

Project name: Be bold and brave - say no to bullying

Category of your project: Line of sight, Natural access, Ownership and identity

Project description: Our project will repurpose an existing outdoor space into a highly visible, inclusive area that promotes safety, connection and wellbeing for all our kids. The design will feature amphitheatre-style seating and a yarning circle to foster collaboration, cultural learning and positive peer to peer engagement. A student designed mural will celebrate identity, strengthen children's sense of belonging and make a statement about bullying, while an outdoor sensory swing will provide therapeutic benefit and a regulation safe space. The open layout of this area enables clear lines of sight, supporting staff to monitor large areas, respond quickly to incidents and discourage unsafe behaviours. By combining functionality with creativity, the project will enhance supervision, increase positive peer to peer interaction and ensure our children feel safe, valued and supported in their school environment.

Intended outcomes: The overarching outcome of our project is to reduce unsafe behaviours and increase positive, prosocial peer to peer behaviours through a functional and inspiring outdoor environment that balances supervision needs with creativity, cultural expression and play. We hope to increase student well-being and safety through an improved line of sight play/learning space, enabling staff to monitor more closely during breaks and respond effectively to incidents. We anticipate that the yarning circle will foster deep listening, build school community and create a safe space for all students to share their knowledge and voice. The amphitheatre seating will create greater opportunities for inclusive, collaborative play and learning, and the sensory swing will support and improve children' wellbeing and regulation.

Plan to spend the funding: Landscaping, Furniture including soft furnishings, Fittings, Signage including art works, Resources (production or purchase)

Funding applied for: \$15 000
