Walk to School Day

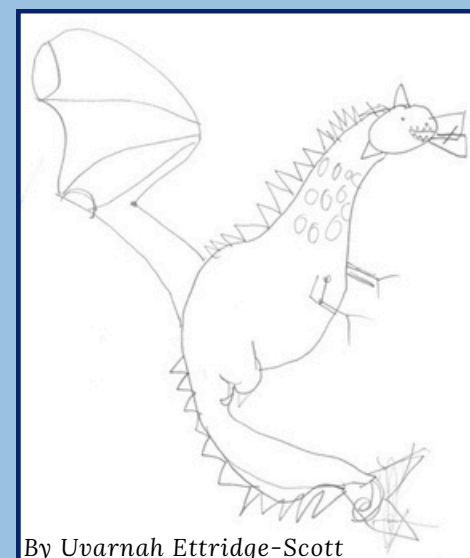
Our annual walk to school day was held today. This was the 26th Anniversary of the event. The event promotes active transport to school, road safety, health & environmental benefits.

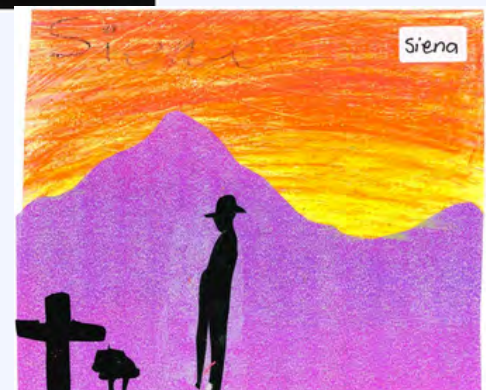

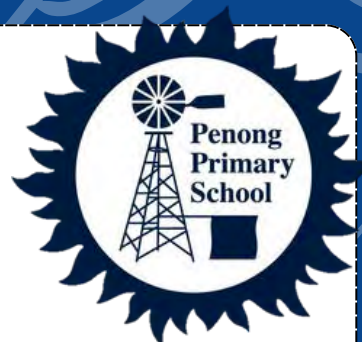
