A huge congratulations to our Principal's Award recipients this term: **Hassan Kamara, Harry Nesbitt and Shaniqua Campbell**.



Holiday Reading

Keep Reading Over the Holidays

The Christmas holidays is the perfect time to relax, but it's also important for children to keep reading so they maintain their skills. Even just ten minutes a day can make a real difference! Here are some simple ideas to support reading at home:

Daily Language & Reading Tips

- **Have conversations:** Explore new words while you chat, and talk about books you read together.
- **Play word games:** Fun activities like I Spy help build sound awareness and vocabulary.
- **Reduce screen time:** Swap a bit of tech time for stories, reading, or imaginative play.

When Reading with Your Child

- Look closely at the pictures and predict what the story might be about.
- Talk together about what's happening in the story and illustrations.
- Highlight tricky words and explain what they mean.
- Join in when you hear rhyming or repeated phrases.
- Pause to ask questions such as "What do you think will happen next?"
- After finishing, encourage your child to retell the story in their own words – beginning, middle, and end.
