From the Principal

Building Strong Mathematical Foundations Through Explicit Direct Instruction and Top 10 Maths

At Glenburnie Primary School, we are committed to helping every student develop confidence and success in mathematics. This year, our teachers are continuing to strengthen maths teaching through the use of **Explicit Direct Instruction (EDI)** and the **Top 10 Maths** approach.

Explicit Direct Instruction is a structured teaching method that ensures students are taught new concepts clearly and systematically. Lessons are carefully sequenced, with teachers modelling new skills, providing guided practice, checking for understanding, and gradually releasing responsibility to students as they build confidence and independence. This approach helps ensure that all students have the opportunity to succeed and reduces gaps in learning.

Our use of Top 10 Maths complements this approach by focusing on the essential mathematical concepts and skills that students need to master at each year level. By identifying and prioritising the most important learning, teachers can provide targeted instruction, regular review, and opportunities for students to apply their knowledge in a variety of contexts.

Students benefit from:

- Clear learning intentions and success criteria.
- Regular opportunities to practise and consolidate skills.
- Immediate feedback and support.

- Increased confidence when tackling mathematical challenges.
- Stronger understanding of mathematical language and problem-solving strategies.

Parents may notice students bringing home mathematical language, strategies, and methods that have been explicitly taught in class. We encourage families to talk about maths in everyday situations such as cooking, shopping, measuring, and budgeting, helping children see the real-world relevance of mathematics.

As part of our ongoing commitment to improving mathematics outcomes for all students, next week our staff will join colleagues from Suttontown Primary School for a pupil-free day focused on strengthening the teaching of multiplication and division. Staff will engage with high-quality resources and teaching strategies from the Top 10 Maths framework, deepening their understanding of how these essential concepts can be taught effectively through Explicit Direct Instruction.

Following this professional learning, staff from both schools will participate in a collaborative planning day. This valuable opportunity will allow teachers to share resources, exchange ideas, and work together to plan engaging and effective mathematics learning experiences for students. Collaboration between our schools helps ensure consistency in teaching practices while providing teachers with access to a wider range of expertise and resources.

By combining Explicit Direct Instruction with Top 10 Maths, and through ongoing professional learning and collaboration, we are creating consistent, high-quality learning experiences that support every student to grow as a capable and confident mathematician.

We look forward to continuing this important work and celebrating our students' mathematical achievements throughout the year.

This semester, every class had the wonderful opportunity to take part in an online visit through Auslan Education Services, where they met Naomi, a Deaf presenter who joined us to celebrate and extend our Auslan learning journey.

With the support of an interpreter to ensure clear communication, students enthusiastically shared signs they have learned throughout the semester, practised their fingerspelling, and had the chance to introduce themselves to Naomi in Auslan. Naomi generously shared about her own background and life, and our students demonstrated their curiosity and thoughtfulness by asking meaningful questions, including how difficult it is to learn Auslan as a Deaf person, how many people belong to the Deaf Community across Australia, and questions about Naomi's personal interests.

Students also had the valuable opportunity to practise asking for clarification when unsure of a sign — an important real-world communication skill. Across all four classes there were many eager, confident learners ready to share what they have been working on, and as a school we are incredibly proud of the progress our students have made in their Auslan learning this semester. It was a truly enriching experience that deepened our students' appreciation for Deaf culture and the Auslan language.

Congratulations to Isla, Effy and Hannah on this fantastic achievement and for representing our school so well!











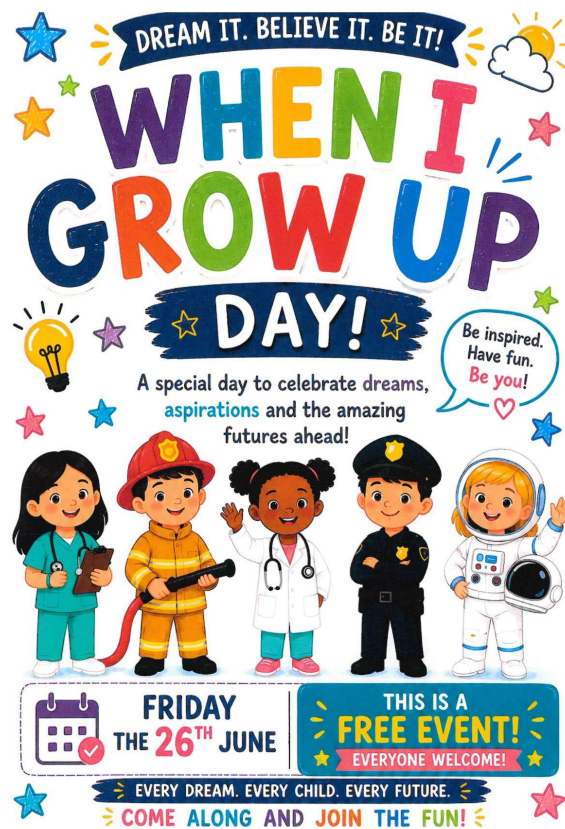
SRC News

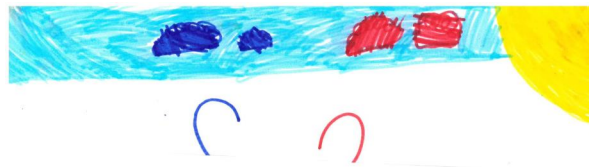


Swimming

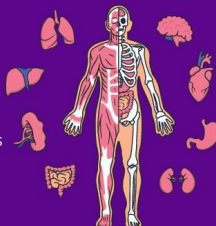
