Excellence and Care

School Uniform Policy

Our school expects all students to wear a school uniform. Wearing a uniform supports a positive image of the school within the community, promotes identity and pride, and helps ensure student safety.

School Uniforms

The following items can be **purchased through the school** via the **front office** or the **QKR app** (images available on the final page):

- Navy polo shirt with white side panels (with school logo)
 - Navy school windcheaters and navy jackets (with school logo)
 - Year 6 commemorative tops (available annually)
 - Navy broad-brimmed hat (Terms 1, 3 & 4; must be in good condition and graffiti-free)
 - School logos (iron-on, available at the office)
 - Blue and White check school dress

Parent-Sourced Uniform Items

Parents may also purchase or provide the following items independently. Iron-on school logos (available from the office) are encouraged on non-school-supplied items.

- Plain navy polo tops, windcheaters, and jackets (no logos other than the school logo)
- Navy skirts, skorts, pants, track pants, and shorts (white stripes allowed; no large brand names)
- Navy or white long-sleeve shirts under short-sleeve tops
- Navy or white scarves, headbands, and hair ties
- Navy headscarves only
- Navy, white, or grey leggings, tights, or stockings (under dresses/skirts/skorts/shorts)
- Navy, white, grey, or black socks (preferred)
- Appropriate footwear for activities (no thongs)

Note: Long hair is recommended to be tied back to help control head lice.



Items Not Permitted

Students are **not permitted** to wear the following:

- Jewellery (excluding medical alert items) such as bracelets, rings, long earrings, or necklaces (unless approved for religious or cultural reasons)
 - Makeup or coloured nail polish
 - Jackets other than those specified in the uniform policy
 - Denim or black pants, skirts, or jackets
 - OSHC hats during school hours

Governing Council

The Governing Council has the authority through the regulations under the Education Act to determine the appropriate dress code for our school and the school leadership must enforce the policy and take appropriate action in relation to wilful and persistent breach of the policy.

Incorrect Uniform Procedures

If any students attends school out of uniform, the following steps will be taken:

- Students not in a correct school top may be lent a spare top for the day
 - Students without a school hat will be required to stay in a designated shaded area during lunch and recess breaks
 - Parents will be contacted if a student consistently wears the incorrect uniform at school
 - Additional consequences may be applied in line with the school's behaviour management policy
