

Preschool

Dear Preschool families,

Welcome to our first newsletter for Term 2!



The first weeks of the term have flown by! We have started Term 2 with our new teacher Alice and our student teacher Georgia. Our Preschool has become a colourful sight as Georgia was focused this fortnight on colour mixing. No materials were safe as the children investigated how colours changed in playdoh when they were mixed, eventually turning into a big brown blob! (see our fortnightly reflection for pictures.) Next, the children became magicians by mixing colourful potions, using water, coloured paint, shaving cream and flowers from around the school. Paints were flying as the children experimented with mixing colours. They described the colours of the rainbow and became curious about what colour they would make when mixing 2 or 3 colours together.

Another highlight of Week 2 was our Mothers and Special Persons afternoon tea and arts and crafts afternoon. Both adults and children were treated to an afternoon tea of scones freshly made by the children, served with jam and cream plus an assortment of cakes, cookies, sandwiches and fairy bread. Our visitors were treated to a manicure (nail polish and hand cream) or had the option of making a necklace or bracelet. There was also painting and playdoh (who recognised that lovely brown blob of playdoh that was used!).


Design and Technology
