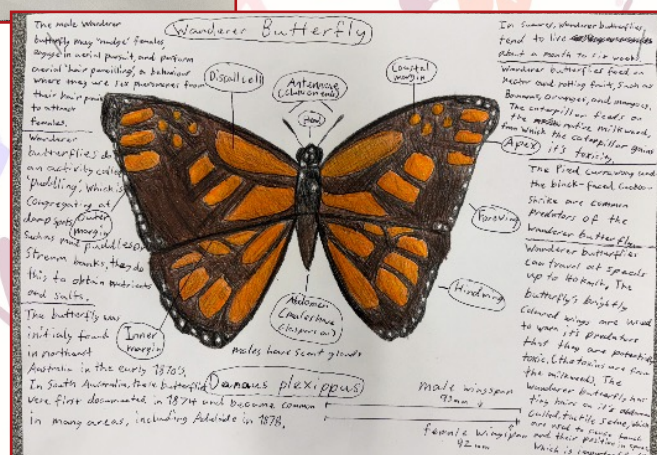
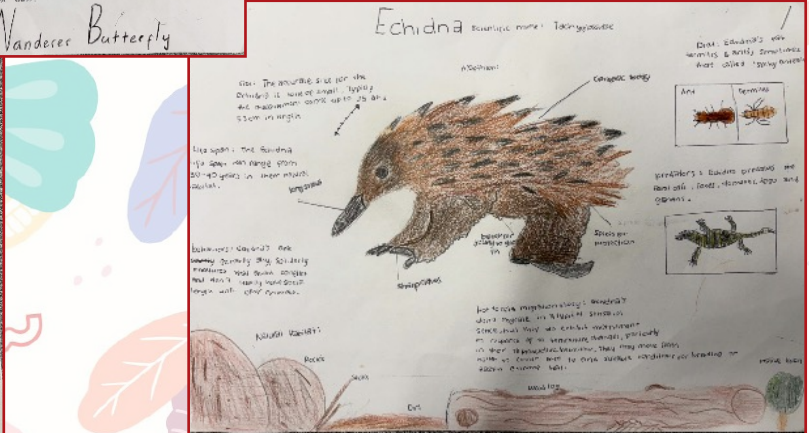
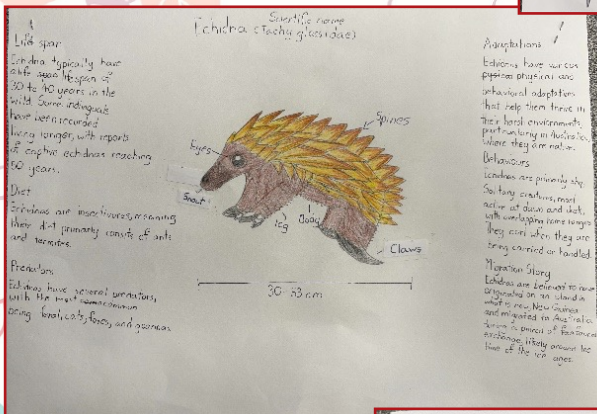
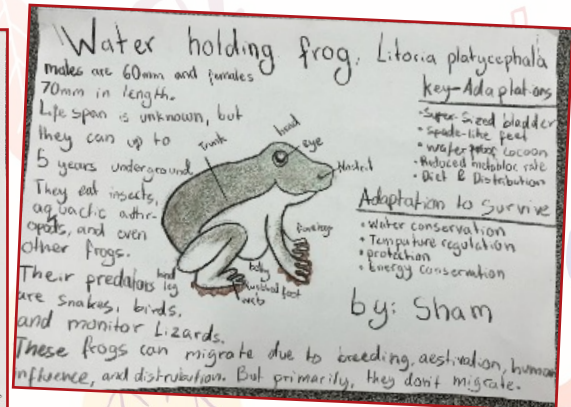
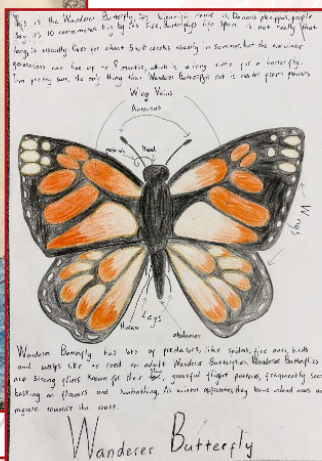
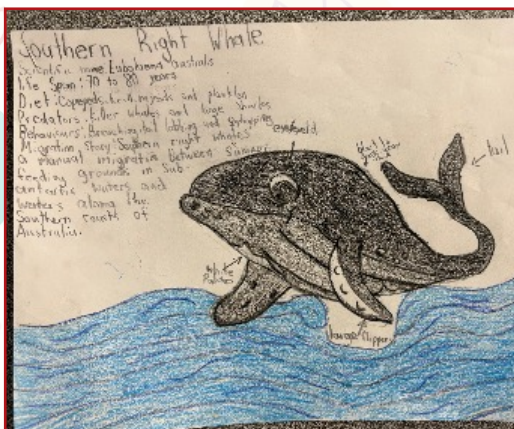
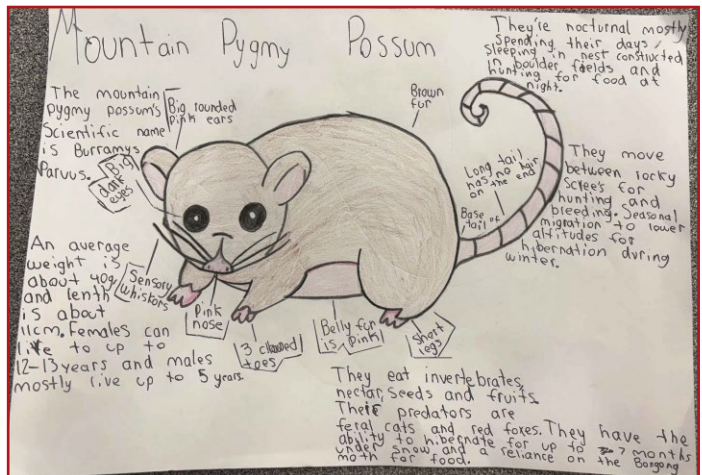
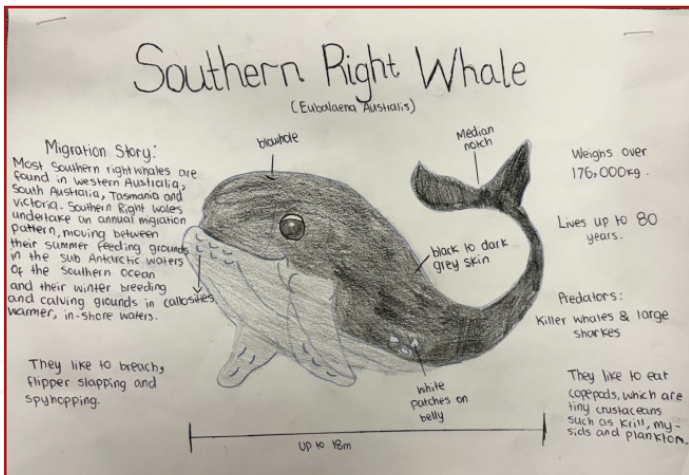


MIXING PLAYDOH TO MAKE NEW COLOURS IN ART

Graduation




