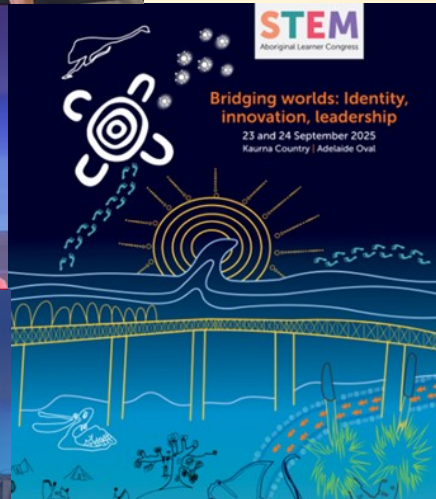
Aboriginal Learners STEM Congress 2025
