Principal's Message

Dear Families,

A warm welcome back to Term 3. I'd like to make a special welcome to our 26 new Mid-Year Intake Reception students and their families as they begin their schooling journey. Welcome also to other students and their families who are new to the school. We start Term 3 with 463 students (389 students same time last year).

We also welcome some new faces as Teachers: Tiffany Young (A4 Reception whilst Sharon Reed enjoys some well deserved long service leave), Kristy Keyes (G7 Year 1), Nick Mitris (M3 Year 4/5), Kat Brooke (A6 Reception Thursday and Friday), and Georgia Scott-Mills (G5 Friday).

Facilities update

I am excited to share with the school community that work is rapidly moving forward regarding the removal of Callistemon building and the installation of a new modular building.

Last week we met with the Capital Programs and Projects team where we were informed that the demolition of Callistemon is planned for over the coming Christmas Break and work to then commence soon after with the installation of the new modular building. Due to safety and the complexity of the work involved in removing Callistemon, there will need to be a closure of the OSHC service whilst the removal takes place. I have informed Camp Australia of this so planning can begin to support those families impacted.

I thank the Department for their support and ongoing work to ensure our school has the appropriate infrastructure in place as our student enrolments increase.

2026 NAPLAN results

Parent packs have arrived and will be sent home to families in the coming week.

NAPLAN is a national test undertaken by all Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students, designed to provide information about student's literacy and numeracy achievements and areas for improvement. NAPLAN tests are one aspect of our school's assessment and reporting processes, they do not replace the extensive, ongoing assessments made by teachers about your child's achievement. Your child's teacher will have the best insight into your child's educational progress. NAPLAN results provide additional information, which can be used along with our other assessment and testing.

When you read your child's report, please take the time to celebrate the success that you see and/or identify areas for improvement. If your child is concerned with their results, remind them that NAPLAN isn't a pass or fail test and there are no rewards or penalties for the result your child achieves. Rather, their report is a point in time snapshot of their achievements in the important areas of literacy and numeracy and their results will help their teacher to provide additional support in their learning.

Please note that the Year 5 Writing report looks slightly different to the other areas reported on, as it does not include the school and national writing mean. This is due to technical issues with the platform on the first day of NAPLAN testing, which resulted in varied experiences. A message has been included on the Individual Student Report (ISR) to help interpret the writing results with caution.

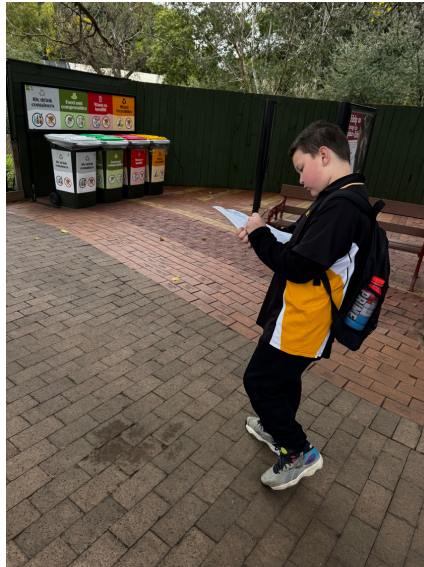
