This term, YVM has focused on fostering a sense of belonging within the senior school. They are exploring various activities for Years 10 to 12 to support this goal. Recently, three of our committed members—Sienna Williams, Chloe Foster, and Jessica Dunn—participated in an online student forum workshop. This event brought together 1,200 public school students to discuss the ongoing development of understanding the new education department strategy with a focus on the Learner Agency.

Key topics included:

- Learning Mode vs Performance Mode: Encouraging students to shift their focus from merely performing to truly engaging in the learning process.
- Student Impact Card Resource: Celebrating and activating this resource to empower student voices and actions.

Looking ahead, YVM members will continue to engage with a student network in Terms 2 and 3. This will allow them to learn with and from peers across the state, further exploring learning and performance modes within our school's context.

Vacation Care is available to children aged 4 to 15 years old, parents are not required to be working for their child/ren to attend. Vacation Care offers a range of activities including a daily planned activity, see program below.

- **WHEN:** Monday to Friday - unless advised
- **TIME:** 8a.m. to 6p.m
- **WHERE:** Stem/Art room in the Primary Courtyard, at the Streaky Bay Area School.
- **WHAT TO PACK:** Water Bottle, lunch & snacks, hat & spare clothes. (please label belonging)
- **COST:** \$55.00 - for 10 hours of care or any part thereof. This amount can be greatly reduced by registering for the CCR percentage.

New enrolments are always welcome. When enrolling in the program, you will need a Customer Reference Number (CRN) from the Family Assistance Office, which is linked to the Childcare Rebate (CCR) (formerly CCB) system. You can register for a CCR either online at www.familyassist.gov.au or by calling 13 61 50. To receive a reduced fee, you must be registered with Centrelink prior to the holiday program beginning.
