#### Focus on Metacognition

Across the school, students continue to develop their understanding of metacognition—the ability to reflect on and think critically about their own learning processes. This ongoing focus is helping students become more selfaware, take ownership of their learning, and develop habits that support deeper and more independent learning. Metacognition remains a key part of our wholeschool approach to improving student outcomes.

**Berry Street Education Model – Student Free Day** Our second Student Free Day dedicated to the Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) will take place on Monday, 25 August. This professional development continues to support staff in embedding traumainformed and relationship-based teaching strategies. It builds on our existing focus on student wellbeing and engagement. The upcoming session will focus specifically on the 'Relationships' domain, further strengthening our capacity to build trust and connection with students.

Year 10 – Careers Expo & Work Experience Our Year 10 students recently attended the Eyre Peninsula Careers Expo in Port Lincoln. This event offered valuable exposure to a wide range of career pathways, including health and science, trades, and tertiary education. Students engaged directly with industry representatives, training organisations, and tertiary providers—broadening their perspectives and sparking new ideas about possible futures.

In the final week of this term, Year 10 students will participate in work experience placements, providing them with meaningful, hands-on insight

into the world of work. This opportunity plays an essential role in supporting their career development and helps inform their future subject selections and post-school planning.

#### Daymap

Finally, the next phase of our Daymap implementation will be rolled out to students and families soon. This update will include key features aimed at improving communication, such as notifications and reminders for



school events, uniform, behaviour and attendance tracking. These additions will make it easier for families to stay informed and engaged with their child's school experience.

As we move toward the end of the term, I thank our students, staff and families for their continued support and commitment to making our school a positive and thriving learning community.

## PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS


## Year 5/6














# Streaky Bay

- COST: \$55.00 for 10 hours of care or any part thereof. This amount can be greatly reduced by registering for the CCR percentage.



You can register for a CCR either online at www.familyassist.gov.au or by calling 13 61 50. To receive a reduced fee, you must be registered with Centrelink prior to the holiday program beginning.

Pre-booking is essential to ensure adequate staffing. All BOOKINGS or cancellations must be made by 7 PM the night before. Same-day cancellations will incur a charge.


