# Students Experience the Powerful Practice of a Cultural Burn

On Thursday, 25th September, a small group of students had the privilege of participating in a Cultural Burn at Talia Station, an event that showcased the deep connection between Aboriginal knowledge and environmental sustainability. The students involved—Deni Edwards, Zion Alexander, Kelvin Pepper, and Darby Brown—were immersed in an experience that blended valuable education, cultural ceremonies, and environmental practices.

The day began with a **Welcome to Country** by Traditional Owners from the Wirangu, Nauo, and Kaurna Indigenous language groups. This was a moment of profound significance as the elders shared stories, teachings, and cultural knowledge. Traditional fire-making fire sticks were used to spark flames used to create a small comfort fire and ignition for the controlled burns.

A Cultural Burn is much more than a controlled fire; it is a practice rooted in thousands of years of Aboriginal land management. We witnessed firsthand the ways in which the Wirangu and Nauo peoples use cool burns to care for Country. These burns promote soil health while supporting revegetation and agricultural sustainability in a uniquely effective way.

Led by Wirangu and Nauo Traditional Owners this event provided a rare and privileged opportunity for students to connect deeply with Indigenous knowledge. By sharing culture and practices, students gained a greater appreciation for how Aboriginal communities have been caring for Country, revitalising land, and protecting biodiversity for thousands of years.

The day underscored how Indigenous practices continue to shape modern approaches to **agriculture**, **horticulture**, **environmental revegetation**, **and carbon capture efforts**, playing a vital role in strategies to combat climate change. By learning through doing and engaging with the wisdom of Traditional Owners, students were given a powerful perspective on environmental stewardship.

Deni, Zion, Kelvin, and Darby represented our school with enthusiasm, thoughtfulness and respect, returning with a deeper understanding of Indigenous history, cultural perspective, and sustainable land management. They have returned to school to enthusiastically share their learning with their class and staff.

As a school, we are grateful for the exciting opportunity to partake in this genuinely significant experience, which reflects our commitment to fostering cultural awareness, environmental action, and real-world learning opportunities.













# 5/6B EXPLANATION TEXTS


Last term, our class was working on Explanation Texts. An explanation text is a type of text that explains a question (How do cars work, how do bees make honey, how are crystals made etc).














# MIDDLE SCHOOL MATTERS


# CHILDREN'S UNIVERSITY STUDENTS - learn about the night sky

Children's University invited Susan Betts, a First Nations Wirangu representative to share her knowledge about Indigenous Astronomy with children at Streaky Bay Area School.

Children learnt how people have studied and used the night sky for tens of thousands of years to guide navigation of country, seas and waterways, predict weather patterns and understand the seasonal behaviour of plants and animals. "The night sky is important to the foundations of Dreamtime stories, social structures and ceremony," says Susan.

The knowledge of the night sky passed down through stories, song and dance provided First Nations people, a sophisticated and deep understanding of the sky and formation of the landscape and such knowledge contributes to our national identity.

Much to the children's delight Susan shared stories of the Emu in the Sky and of the Seven Sisters. She encouraged all to take time to explore the night skies.
