Social Media Age Restrictions

From 10 December 2025, age-restricted social media platforms will have to take reasonable steps to prevent Australians under 16 from creating or keeping accounts.

Why the social media delay?

The changes aim to protect under-16s from pressures and risks they can be exposed to while logged in to social media accounts. These come from design features in the platforms that:

- encourage them to spend too much time on screens for example, by prompting them with "streaks" or streams of notifications and alerts, and pressuring them to view disappearing content
- increase the likelihood of exposure to negative, upsetting or manipulative content served up in their feeds by algorithms.

These features have been linked to harms to health and wellbeing – including increased stress levels, and reduced sleep and concentration.

The delay provides under-16s with the time to:

- learn about social media's benefits and risks
- build digital, social and emotional skills
- understand the importance of reaching out for help if things go wrong.

While the responsibility rests with the platforms themselves to take reasonable steps to prevent under-16s from having accounts, we can all play a part.

We can help our young people deal with these changes and build their general online safety at the same time. The keys are clear communication, and modelling of safe and positive online behaviours.

We are delighted to announce that tickets for the R–9 School Performance held on Friday 5 December are now available for the 11.30am & 5.30pm sessions


Join us on a journey through time as Mary and Ted reflect on 100 years of change, challenges, and treasured memories with their daughter Kath and granddaughter Georgie.

A timely and friendly reminder from the Streaky Bay Police

Following several recent incidents of motorbikes and quadbikes being ridden on local roads, roadside reserves, beaches and camping grounds in Streaky Bay and surrounds including Bairds Bay, Sceale Bay, Eba Anchorage & Perlubie.

Police have issued and are issuing a warning to all locals and visitors.

Most of our beaches are still accessible to motor vehicles. Members of the public are reminded that the *road rules still apply on these beaches* and reserves

quadbikes on a beach and roadside reserves, with trail bikes that cannot be registered, and the riders being unlicenced minors, have seen expiations in excess of \$1,600 issued and consideration given to Recent past investigations into riders using motorbikes and the impounding of their motorcycles

Potential offences in these circumstances include:

- 1. driving a motor vehicle unregistered and uninsured,
- driving a motor vehicle on a road without number plates assigned.

If the *rider doesn't hold an appropriate motorcycle licence*, they *could* be liable for being charged with;

- driving a motor vehicle unlicenced, resulting in a court appearance and having their vehicle impounded with associated costs.
- 4. Parents and Guardians are also liable for permitting their children to ride in these circumstances, with infringement notices being issued to the parent or guardian of riders under the age of 18 years.



All beaches have designated speed limits which local police are monitoring. These speed limits are to ensure the safety of all beach

adhere to the new default beach speed limit of 40km/hour and From Friday, 1 December 2023, for over 23 months now drivers must 25km/hour within 50 metres of a person, unless otherwise signposted. Fines and demerit points will apply for exceeding these limits. Roadside verges and reserves are by law a road related area and as such it is deemed the same by law as riding on the actual road when an incident or tragedy occurs. Police request all road and beach users; to please ensure they have the appropriate licence and registration for the motor vehicle they are using and enjoy the outdoors lawfully and safely this holiday



You can register for a CCR either online at www.familyassist.gov.au or by calling 13 61 50. To receive a reduced fee, you must be registered with Centrelink prior to the holiday program beginning.
