

APPLYING FOR A SCHOOL CARD



All types of School Card applications are now online.

You can access the online forms from any device that gets internet, including mobile devices, such as tablets and smart phones, as well as laptops and computers.

Applying online is easy! Simply follow the steps below.

- STEP 1** Visit sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard
- STEP 2** Select the type of School Card you would like to apply for (for example 'Type A') and follow the prompts.
- STEP 3** Complete all mandatory fields.
Please note: you cannot submit your application unless all mandatory fields are complete.
- STEP 4** Once you have completed a page click on the 'NEXT' button.
- STEP 5** Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button.
Please note: if you exit the form without clicking 'SUBMIT' your details will be lost.

You can save the form, and return to complete it at another time, by clicking on the 'SAVE' button.

Swimming Carnival 2026

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

On Friday 13th February, students will participate in the annual Streaky Bay Area School Swimming Carnival. The carnival will run as a normal school day, with the first bell at 8:45 am and dismissal at 3:05 pm. Parents and caregivers are asked to contact the school if their child/ren are unable to attend the swimming carnival.

Throughout the day, students will participate in a variety of individual events, including freestyle, backstroke, and breaststroke. The carnival will conclude with relay events, where house teams face off to win the overall championship.

Points are awarded for participation in each event, with bonus points for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finishes, as well as for demonstrating good sportsmanship. **Participation is key — the more students involved, the more points their house team can earn!**

- Students under 7 will participate in a modified program in the Primary Unit on the day.

Weather Contingency:

If poor weather conditions are forecast, or if the temperature is predicted to be 36°C or above in Ceduna (as per the ABC 7:00 pm news the night before), the carnival will be postponed to Monday, 16th February.

Pool Closure:

The pool will be closed from 3:05 pm on Thursday 12th February, until 8:30 am on Saturday 14th February to allow time for set-up and post-carnival cleaning.

Grape harvest 2026

Last week two classes undertook the annual grape harvest. Considering the conditions on Australia Day we were exceptionally lucky that there was anything left to harvest at all!

On Monday the Year 8 class picked the red grapes resulting in 232 Kg of fruit in the tub. On Tuesday the Year 6/7 B class undertook the picking of the white grapes, yielding only 162Kg of fruit. These were very heat effected and the picking was much slower. Both classes worked extremely well at harvesting and completing the task.

Thanks to subject and class teachers (Cass Walker and Leah Chynoweth) for making their groups available to help with harvest. Thanks also to Belinda Black, Lucas Mosey, Ross McTaggart and in particular Garry Black for their assistance with logistics, preparation and supervision on each day.

Due to the small volumes of fruit, the winemaker at Waite institute has decided to put the two varieties of fruit together to make one line (A Rosé) for the 2026 Vintage. This should be available for purchase around August.


