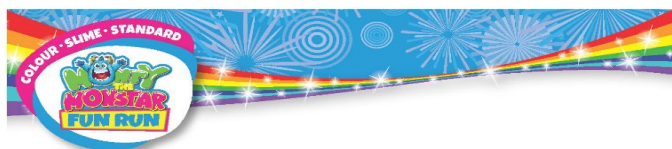

STUDENT ABSENCES



It would be appreciated if parents/guardians could **notify the school Front Office of your child/s absence via the Daymap app, email or phone. This is preferable to messaging the class teacher**, as your child will often have more than one teacher throughout the day and the other teachers do not know this information, therefore will mark your child **Unexplained** for their lesson. If the Front Office is notified via Daymap etc, your child's absence will be recorded for the whole day and each teacher will be able to see this.

It is an Education Department requirement to have parent/guardians provide the school with a reason unless a student exemption form has been granted prior to the absence. This gives the school a reason and does not leave the student with an unexplained absence.

Enter your child's surname and birthdate and you are ready to start ordering. Once logged in, you can also order for siblings and family photos.

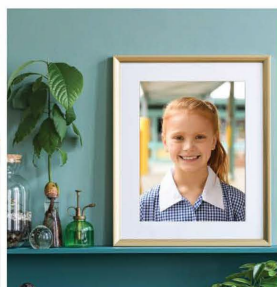

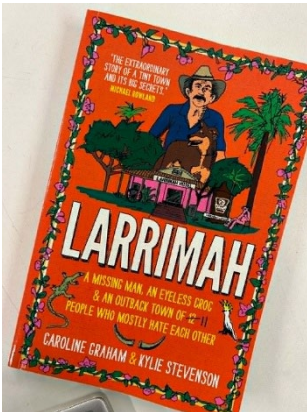

MIDDLE SCHOOL MATTERS

Investigating the Mystery of Larrimah: Year 9 English Become Crime Scene Detectives



This term, our Year 9 English students have stepped into the world of investigation as they explore one of Australia's most fascinating unsolved mysteries – the disappearance of Paddy Moriarty from the tiny Northern Territory town of Larrimah. Using the documentary *Last Stop Larrimah* and extracts from the novel *Larrimah*, students have analysed evidence, built a timeline of events, and explored the many unanswered questions surrounding the case.



Along the way, we've had tears, moments of shock, heated debates and a whole lot of questions as students developed and defended their own theories about what really happened.

The investigation is far from over! Students will soon transform their findings into their own true crime podcasts before taking part in a class debate, where they'll use evidence to argue their case. It has been wonderful to see students so engaged in a unit that combines critical thinking, collaboration, creativity, and a genuine love of learning.
