New Social Media Bans: An Opportunity to Start Important Conversations



As you may have seen in the news, new government regulations will take effect this December, placing greater restrictions on the use of social media by children under the age of 16. The South Australian Department for Education, along with our own school community, welcomes these changes as a positive step towards creating safer and healthier online environments for our young people. From 10 December 2025, the restrictions are likely to apply to Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, TikTok, X (formerly Twitter) and YouTube, among other platforms.

This is not a ban, it's a delay to having accounts and these changes are designed to help protect young users from risks and pressures associated with social media, such as cyberbullying, exposure to inappropriate content, and unhealthy comparisons with others.

While social media does offer ways to stay connected, childhood should primarily be about discovery, play, and building friendships face-to-face. We encourage families to view this as a valuable opportunity to have open conversations about online behaviour, digital citizenship,

and the potential risks linked to social media.

We know many children at Seacliff Primary are already active on these platforms, so now is a great time to talk as a family about your expectations and, if appropriate, begin removing social media apps from your child's devices in preparation for the changes. Setting clear boundaries together can help prevent misunderstandings and unnecessary pressure once the new regulations begin.

As we move towards this important change, I encourage you to support your child in exploring enjoyable ways to connect that don't need a screen. Remind your children (and all of us!) that friendships often grow strongest through sharing experiences in the real world—and some of the best memories are made offline.

Room 1, 2 and 16 – Farm Barn Excursion

Recently, Rooms 1, 2 and 16 visited The Farm Barn in Hahndorf as part of our Design and Technologies, Science and HASS learning. Students enjoyed a range of hands-on experiences with the animals and observed engaging demonstrations such as cow milking and reptile handling. They explored how farm machinery has evolved over time to make our lives easier, learnt about living things and life cycles, and discovered where our food comes from and how it is grown. In class, students have also been reading *George the Farmer* by Simone Kain, learning about topics such as drone farming, the impact of weather, and the importance of bees and beehives. This story has helped students make meaningful connections to their learning and deepen their understanding during their visit to The Farm Barn.


