#### Notification of works

As part of the City of Holdfast Bay Road Construction Program, our contractor Kites Concrete will be undertaking kerb ramp upgrades kerb and water table works in Kauri Parade (Pine Avenue to Barwell Avenue).

Works are expected to be undertaken in two stages, the first stage commencing Monday 15 December 2025 for one week and the second stage commencing early January 2026 for up to two weeks.

All works are anticipated to be completed prior to school returning, unless program interruption occurs due to inclement weather. The scope of works includes:

- Reconstructing lifted and damaged kerb and water table.
- Upgrading kerb ramps at the school crossing to be compliant with Australian Standards and Disability Discrimination Act.

During construction, there will be traffic management and temporary parking controls in place for the safety of the workers and the public, this will include road closures and detours.

We apologise for any inconvenience during construction and ask for your patience when works are affecting your driveway. We will endeavour to make minimal disruption to your daily activity.

Kites Concrete will send a further notification to affected residents prior to site works commencing with further details.
