Anniece – It was really calm and peacfulf. It couldn't go wrong


Violet – It was so cool to see everbodies colours and paint patterns. Mr A is awesome.

Elsie – It was really fun and colourful.


JP Maths - Patterning and Symmetry

Students investigated patterns and shapes using mirrors to create images that reflect and describe symmetry

























SAPSASA Golf

Overall, the day was really fun and I'd like to say thank you to Mum and Dad for getting me in so quickly and my Uncle Sam for driving me over there.


