

As a school community, we are excited to continue building on our site learning priorities:

- <u>Numeracy</u>: We encourage all students to keep practising their numeracy skills at home. Consistent practice is key to developing confidence and competence in this area (remember to sign off in communication book).
- <u>Literacy</u>: Our focus on improving reading and spelling achievement for all learners remains a priority. We ask families to support this by ensuring children read at home for at least 10 minutes, three times a week, and have it signed off in their communication books.
- <u>Wellbeing</u>: We are dedicated to enhancing resilience—both academically and personally—for all our learners. Our ongoing work within the Berry Street program will continue to support this vital work.



Book Week Parade: "BOOK YOUR ADVENTURE"


"BOOK YOUR ADVENTURE" is the theme of this years Book Week BUT use this for inspiration or use your imagination.




