Spending time outdoors in school holidays

Getting Primary School students out to play during holidays is crucial for their overall development. It promotes physical fitness and helps prevent childhood obesity by encouraging active lifestyles. Outdoor play enhances motor skills, coordination and strength, supporting healthy growth. Socially, it fosters teamwork, communication and conflict resolution as your child engages with other students. Creativity flourishes in unstructured outdoor environments, sparking imagination and problem-solving abilities. Exposure to nature instills environmental awareness and a connection to the world around them. Additionally, outdoor play provides a break from video games, social media and watching TV for large amounts of time without a break, contributing to better mental health and a well-rounded childhood experience. Families do not need money to spend time outdoors as simply going for a walk is beneficial to your children's mental health.

Here are some "Would you rather?" questions you might like to use to start a conversation with your family in the holidays.

- Be able to fly, or be able to turn invisible?
- Take a bath in ice, or in jelly?
- Live in a treehouse, or live in an igloo?












Engineering tomorrow Electric Vehicles Lab



Arbury Camp Medication Requirements

Please read if your child/ren requires medication while on camp next term and undertake the appropriate processes. Medication cannot be sent on camp without following the guidelines below. Thank you.

'Medication' refers to any:

- · prescribed or non-prescribed medication
- over the counter medications
- · alternative therapies (vitamins, minerals, supplements).

Education and care service staff can only administer medication:

- orally
- optically (eye drops)
- aurally (ear drops)
- inhaled
- topically.





MEDICAT

A Medication Agreement form needs to be completed by the parent for **all** medication, vitamins, supplements, etc.

Medication that is labelled *PRN* (as needed), to be taken as directed or similar does not provide sufficient information and cannot be administered in the education or care service.

A healthcare professional must complete the Medication Agreement if the medication is controlled drugs (S8 and some S4), oxygen, insulin or pain relief required to be administered more than 3 times in one week.

Medication Agreement and Asthma Care Plan forms are available from the front office. If there is more than one medication to be taken, use the multiple medications form.

All medication, vitamins, supplements, etc. **must** be labelled with a pharmacy label that matches the details on the Medication Agreement Form.

Parents should only send enough medication for the duration of camp. We recommend that parents obtain a "Webster Pack" from the pharmacy as this aids in the correct administration by school staff.

If the child has an Asthma Preventer, this must be included on the Asthma Care Plan that we have at school, in order for us to administer it.
