Colour Run Bordertown Bakery




The school was transformed into a huge dust of colour on Thursday week 10 last term as we all got hit with a rainbow of colour while participating in the annual runathon.

FROM OUR PASTORAL CARE WORKER

Congratulations to this amazing bunch of Mums who have recently completed Circle of Security Parenting! These mums invested in 8 weeks of acknowledging the important role they play as an 'Attachment figure' in their children's lives, and the beautifully rich and important role this has in creating and forming our wonderful little people.

Through participating in Circle of Security, not only have these mums gained invaluable knowledge on how to connect with and respond to their children's social and emotional needs, they can recognise areas within themselves that may trigger their own responses to our childrens behaviours.

Circle of Security is based on Attachment Theory, a well known theory within Developmental Psychology that describes the needs of children from birth right through to adult hood and the importance relationships and connection have in building resilience, kindness, executive functioning and mental strength.

Circle of Security takes the brain science of co-regulation (in Circle language, we call this 'Organise My Feelings'), and understanding children's needs as they go about their days of exploring, learning, and coming back to you as their safe haven, and the vital role of being 'in relationship' with our children.





- insights into current trends and safety strategies in young people's online interactions.
- effective communication skills to support open discussions with their children.
