## Haylee Rodert

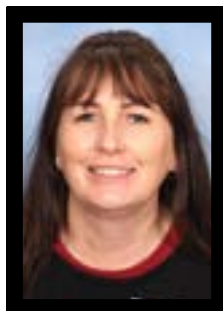
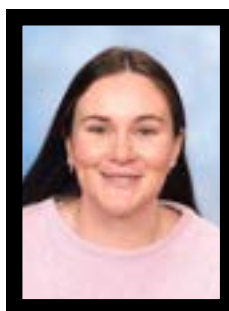

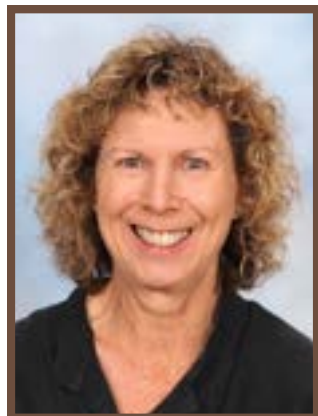
**Lorraine Verco**

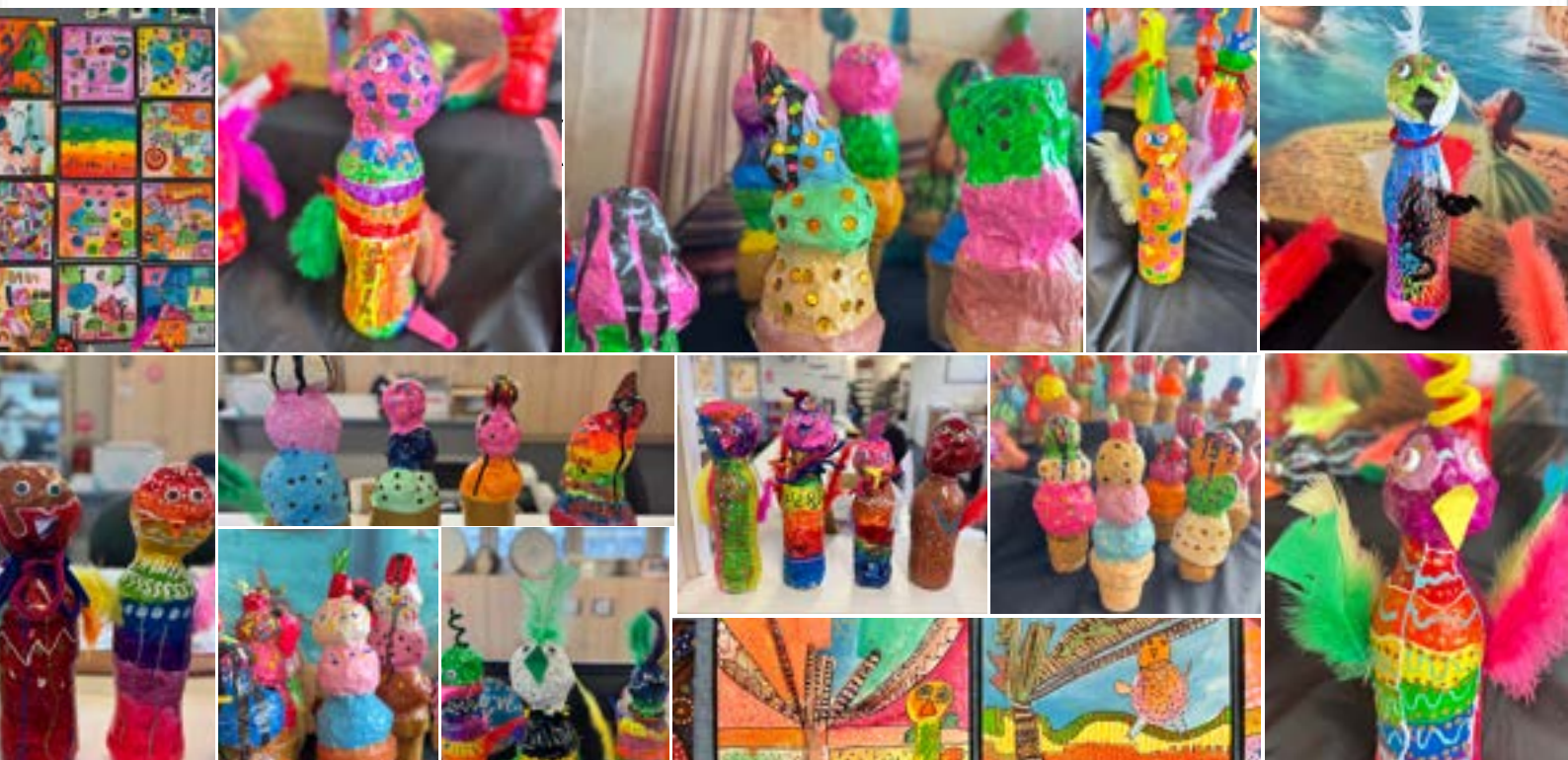
# Premier's Reading Challenge
