KIDS IN SPACE ADELAIDE SHOWCASE

On Tuesday of Week 6, nine Year 6 students travelled to Adelaide to participate in the Makers Empire – Kids in Space Showcase Day. This event provided our students with the opportunity to present their work to experts from the space industry, representatives from Makers Empire, and students from other schools.

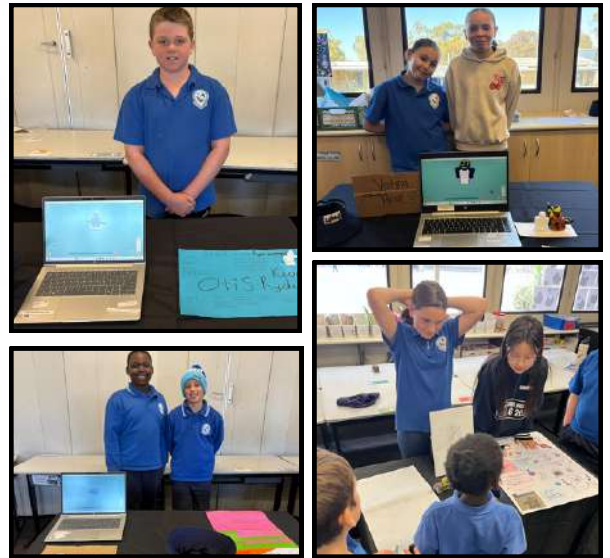
Kids in Space is a program facilitated by Makers Empire, where students are challenged to design solutions to help astronauts work or live in space. The project involved researching space-related problems, developing prototypes, and designing solutions using the Makers Empire app, which were then 3D printed.

Through our school's involvement in the Kids in Space program, we received a complimentary 3D printer, a year-long subscription to Makers Empire for all students, and professional development for our Year 5/6 teachers.

Congratulations to the students who were selected to participate in this year's Maths Challenge. The Maths Challenge is a problem-solving program designed to foster a deeper understanding of the power of mathematics and inspire a genuine joy in mathematical problem solving. Throughout the program, our students tackle a range of challenging mathematical problems that encourage collaboration, creativity, and critical thinking. The dedication, perseverance, and enthusiasm shown by our Maths Challenge participants is something we are all very proud of. In week 5, our school participated in the Talk Money with Ecstra Foundation program, which included two interactive workshops designed to help Australian students learn money lessons for life, to be confident talking about money and to make informed financial decisions.

Our Year 5-6 students attended the Talking about money workshops, where they talked about how people think, feel and act with money and learned about the HEARD framework to help them have constructive conversations about money.

The students and teachers enjoyed the workshops and definitely learnt some important financial concepts and lessons about money.

ICAS assessments

We are pleased to announce that Bordertown Primary School will be participating in the ICAS Competitions next term. All competitions will be completed at school, however, parents are required to register and pay online. In the coming weeks, families will receive a letter with further information, including how to register, as well as specific prices and dates for each subject.





ICAS offers students from Years 2 to 12 the opportunity to compete in six key literacy and STEM subjects: English, Writing, Spelling Bee, Science, Mathematics, and Digital Technologies. These assessments are designed to extend students beyond the regular curriculum, rewarding higher-order thinking and the application of knowledge in new and challenging contexts.

With more than 10 million students from 16,000 schools across 41 countries having participated, ICAS is recognised as one of the largest and most respected academic competitions worldwide.
