Companion Dog

The last newsletter was meant to seek community feedback regarding Playford Primary School having a 'companion dog' on site. Animals have the amazing ability to support students when they are upset or heightened. The plan is to obtain a pup (Golden Retriever or Labrador) and employ a dog trainer to train the dog, with the support of the students. Obviously, there are a number of things that we need to ensure happens to support our students, staff and families, but before any of that can or will occur, we are seeking feedback from the community. The dog will be attached to an individual staff member and will not be on site or available for students to access at all times, as we also need to ensure the wellbeing needs of the dog are being met. We appreciate that everyone is different; some people have dog allergies, some people are afraid of dogs and some people have not had much experience or opportunity to be around dogs. We would best aim to support all students in families if we have an awareness of what the 'issues / concerns' are. 
Reconciliation Week Artwork



INCLUSIVE MORNING TEA






AUTISM INCLUSION CONFERENCE

Once again for Remembrance Day this year, Playford Primary will be remembering our school communities' military members both past and present.


If you have family members that have served our country, we would love you to share. Please send in a photo, along with their name and a little story about them
