Nature Play Update

The Junior Primary Nature Play space is really taking shape and it's looking fantastic. The sandpit and waterway are now complete (I've had a go myself!) and I know students are going to have endless fun exploring the endless possibilities and opportunities for creative play.

The tower, tumble bars, ropes course and log scramble are very close to being finished, with the climbing net now just waiting for delivery. The builders have put great care into crafting a one-of-a-kind structure that will challenge our students to problem-solve and work together as they navigate it.





What's left? The pathways, circular teaching area, cubbies, seating nooks and landscaping. The builders are aiming to have it all wrapped up by Week 9, with a grand opening in Week 9 or 10. We can't wait to share this amazing space with our community!

On top of this, we've also committed to developing a Primary Nature Play area behind the soccer goals on the oval. Year 6 Aboriginal Students Shine in STEM Challenge

We are thrilled to share the exciting achievements of our Year 6 Aboriginal students who recently participated in a STEM challenge at Burton Primary as part of Science Week. This inspiring event was a wonderful opportunity for our students to engage in hands-on learning and showcase their talents.

The challenge involved creating and coding a STEMSEL microchip to develop an Auto Farm Gate for cars. The innovative design required the gate to remain closed to animals but open and re-close for cars. The smart sensor was programmed to open only for cars, thanks to the strategic positioning of the beam, ensuring it did not activate for sheep.

This week, students will continue to build and decorate their STEM models at school, as they prepare to display their work at the Royal Adelaide Show.

Congratulations to our talented students for their hard work and dedication. We look forward to seeing their continued success in STEM and we are looking forward in presenting this at the royal Adelaide show.

Green Adelaide Grant Pudnapinthi Purrurna Mudli-ana Ngurru: Bringing Biodiversity Back to SNPS

I'm really excited to let you know that Salisbury North Primary School has been successful in receiving a Grassroots Grant from the Green Adelaide Board. We've been awarded close to \$50,000 to support our project, Pudnapinthi Purrurna Mudli-ana Ngurru: Bringing Biodiversity Back to SNPS, just outside our Aboriginal Education Room, Paitya Wardli.

With this funding, we'll be creating a new outdoor learning space that includes a native garden, bush tucker plants, and a yarning circle. The garden will be carefully designed to increase biodiversity and provide opportunities for hands-on learning in science, sustainability, and culture. It will also be a special place for connection and reflection, particularly for our Aboriginal students, while being open and meaningful for all students.

To make the space even more vibrant, Aboriginal artist Scott Rathman will be painting the outside of Paitya Wardli, adding another layer of cultural expression and connection to the project. Unfortunately rain has pushed this painting back, but keep an eye out for it in the coming weeks.

Over the coming months we'll be meeting with landscaping companies to get quotes, and our students will play an important role in helping design the space. We're hoping to break ground either late 2025 or early 2026 — so watch this space!

This new area will tie in beautifully with our nature play and other green initiatives across the school, helping us grow as a place where students can learn, play and connect with the environment.









