## A Note From the Principal

#### Dear families,

We've reached Week 6 of Term 4, which means that after this week, we are down to just three weeks to go — and we all know how quickly that time will fly!

Over the past few weeks, we've been busy reviewing our work for 2025 and considering where we can make our biggest impact in 2026. This coming Monday, on our Pupil Free Day, staff will be taking a deep dive into our effectiveness this year and identifying key areas for growth moving forward.

Our students have been doing the same important work. In our last newsletter, I shared that students had completed a Pulse Check Survey to help us understand what we're doing well and where we can continue to improve student wellbeing. We were pleased to see that student-teacher connections are very strong across the whole site. Students did identify, however, that kindness between students is an area we can strengthen.

Teachers took this feedback straight back to their classes, and together they explored ways to make SNPS a kinder place to be. Students brainstormed long-term ideas and put short-term kindness actions in place for this term to create some immediate impact. It has been wonderful to see every class doing something meaningful to spread kindness!





#### A Note From the Principal ...

Some classes have created Kindness Walls, others are completing Kindness Challenges, and some are exploring books and stories about what it means to be a kind member of our community. Please take a moment to ask your children about how they're spreading kindness at SNPS. You'll be proud of what you hear!

Next week, work will begin on our Primary Nature Play Space. This will mean part of the oval will be temporarily closed during construction. While it won't be as large as the JP space, it will offer exciting new play opportunities for our older students — something they are very much looking forward to.

This week we also welcomed our 2026 Reception students for their very first school visit. These will take place every Wednesday for the remainder of the term. On Wednesday of Week 9 (10th December), we will hold our Moving Up Morning. New families are invited to join us at 8:45am for a family information session and short tour, after which all students will meet their 2026 teachers during Lessons 2 and 3. This is a great opportunity for students to begin forming relationships and feeling confident about next year.

We are still seeking a Canteen Manager and volunteers to support our canteen in 2026. This service cannot operate without a committed manager and volunteer support. If you or someone you know may be interested, please contact Dianna in the front office. Let's work together to keep this vital resource running for our students.

A reminder that next Friday, 28th November, is our School Colour Run!

This is our biggest fundraising event of the year, and students are bursting with excitement. We are raising money for a brand-new swing set to be installed on the oval next to the playground in early 2026. The set will include two single swings and a bucket swing.

So far, we have raised \$8,508.50 toward our goal of \$15,000 — that's another \$6,491.50 to raise in the next week! Thank you to everyone who has been mowing lawns, returning cans and bottles, doing odd jobs, and supporting students' efforts. Let's keep the momentum going for one final big week!

With only three weeks left, the rest of the term is going to move fast. We have our End-of-Year Concert, Year 6 Graduation, PBL End-of-Year Celebration at the Salisbury Pool, and many other special events coming up. I look forward to seeing you at these celebrations as we recognise a fantastic year of learning, growth, and community.

#### **Aboriginal Education Update**

This term in Kaurna Language classes, Red Unit Aboriginal students have been learning how to introduce themselves and ask others their names. We have also been exploring vocabulary related to body parts, animals, and numbers. Students have enjoyed engaging activities such as card games and Kaurna songs, which have helped to strengthen their understanding of language and culture.

A highlight of the term was celebrating the achievements of two of our senior boys, who successfully graduated from the GO Foundation program. They had the privilege of attending the awards ceremony at the Playford Hotel in the city—a special event recognising Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students at various stages of their educational journeys. The ceremony celebrated students graduating from primary school and transitioning into high school, high school graduates moving into employment or further education pathways such as university or TAFE, and university graduates completing diplomas, masters, or honours in their respective fields.

It was a memorable evening, and our students thoroughly enjoyed the experience and the opportunity to be acknowledged for their hard work throughout 2025. We are extremely proud of their achievements and grateful to the GO Foundation for their ongoing support and commitment to empowering our students through education.

## MATHS FLUENCY

In Term 3, our teachers participated in professional learning on teaching maths fact fluency and tracking students' progress. The aim is for students to recall maths facts accurately and automatically, ensuring that a lack of fluency does not hinder their ability to solve more complex problems. The assessments provide valuable data to guide our teaching and support every child's progress in mathematics. Since this learning, teachers have been implementing strategies to help students learn their facts efficiently. Many have observed increased engagement, with students becoming more aware of which facts to focus on and how they learn best. This term, we will conduct a second round of assessments to measure impact and inform our planning for 2026.


Intervention has now wrapped up for another year! We are so proud of all the progress our students have made in both reading and spelling!


